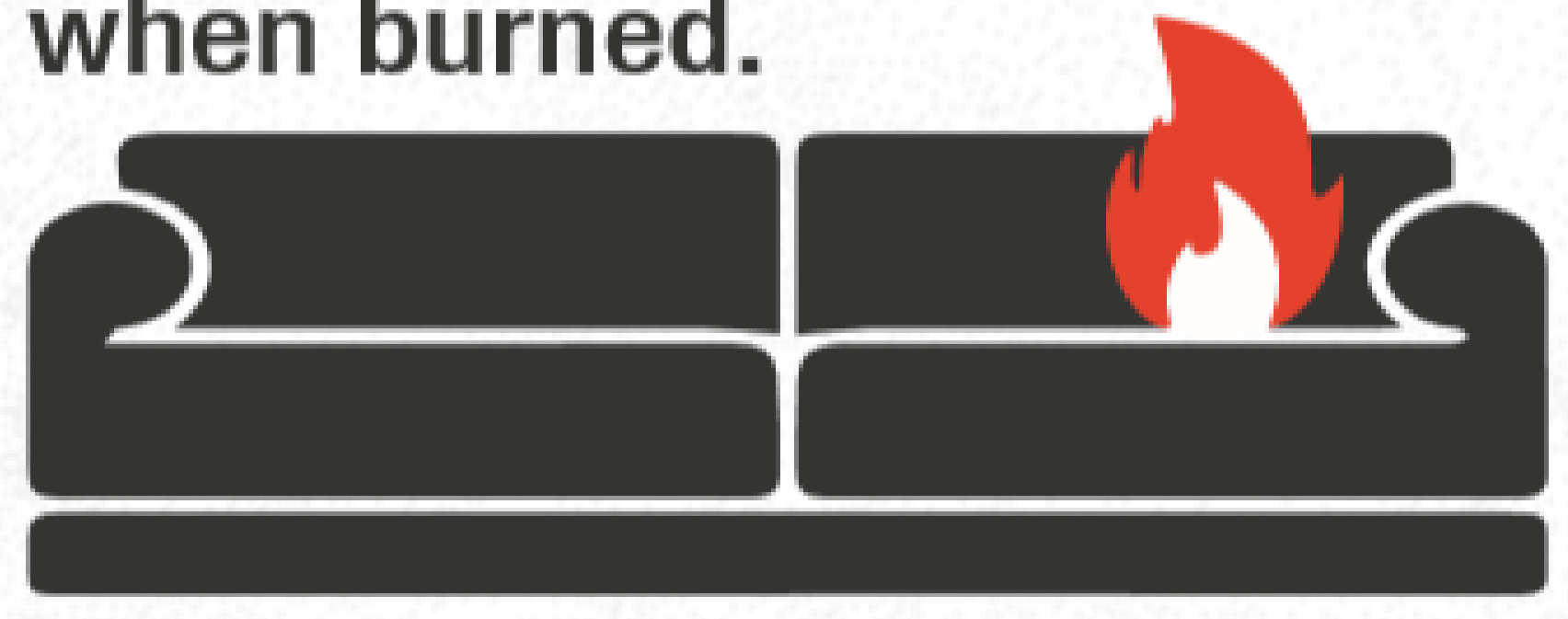

Five Things You Can Do



Wear appropriate respiratory protection throughout the fire investigation to limit inhalation of carcinogens.



Keep contaminated gear out of passenger compartment of vehicles.



Maintain a personal exposure log of all fire investigations.



Clean yourself off during gross decon to remove soot and other carcinogens.



Make sure your gear is cleaned after every fire and inspected regularly.
